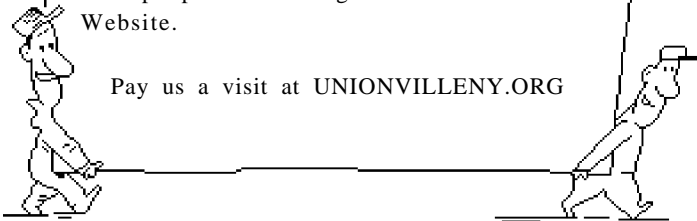

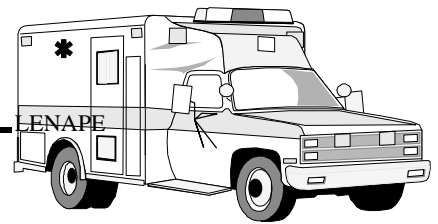

The Village Board is applying for a grant from the Orange County Community Development program to enable us to proceed with the restoration and renovation of the recently purchased 12 Main Street property.

Our goal is to create a "Community Center" which can be used to provide meeting rooms (with kitchenettes) for community groups and organizations (seniors, youths, Lions, American Legion, Ambulance Corps, et cetera) and a Library complete with state-of-the-art computer terminals as well as the usual accoutrements found in any libraries.

In keeping with the Village Board's aim to honor our local history, the exterior of the building is to be restored as closely as reasonably possible to its original appearance.
